Liturgy Note: Veiled Crosses

The veiling of crosses in the Church is one of the most notably features of our worship during Lent. Following medieval English custom (different from continental Christian practice), crosses in the Church veiled from Ash Wednesday through to the Easter Vigil and First Communion of Easter. Why? There are at least three reasons. Firstly, Lent has historically been a time to obscure ornamentation in the Church just as we eschew luxuries in life. And so, for example, the choral settings sung by the choir in this season are far simpler than is customary. Secondly, the glory of Christ is nowhere more 'veiled' than in his journey to the Cross. Thirdly, with the disciples in the Gospel read on the Sunday before Lent, though we know the Messiah must suffer, the rationale is obscure to us -- "they (the disciples" understood none of these things". We must discover again year after year the saving love of God shown in the suffering Christ.

Concert for FSGS: The Halls of Sanssouci

A Concert of Chamber Music from Sanssouci Palace in 18th Century Potsdam

On Saturday March 12, 2016 at 2:30 pm **The Halls of Sanssouci - A Concert of Chamber Music from Sanssouci Palace in 18th Century Potsdam** will be performed at St. George's Round Church, 2222 Brunswick St., Halifax. The concert featuring Henri Gauci on baroque transverse flute, Hilary Brown on cello and Garth MacPhee on harpsichord will be done on period instruments - reproductions of historic musical instruments used in the baroque period. This concert will explore the musicians employed by Frederick II King of Prussia at Sanssouci Palace in Potsdam, Prussia, and include works by Johann Joachim Quantz, Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach, Johann Gottlieb Graun and Franz Benda.

Located on the outskirts of modern day Berlin and named for the French phrase "Without Care," Sanssouci, the King's Summer Palace, was Frederick's refuge to escape the trials and pressures of courtly, political and military duties. The elaborate and highly ornate palace embodied Frederick's cultural world. It was at Sanssouci that Frederick assembled an impressive entourage of the finest musicians and composers in Europe, transforming it into a beacon of enlightenment and culture creating a flourishing centre of musical life.

Admission will be by donation at the door and all proceeds will be in support of the Friends of St. George's Society.
